



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Sustainable Development starts with Education



- **Education** is at the heart of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development essential for the success of all SDGs
- Education has a catalytic impact on health, employment, income and advancing gender equality
- Education transmits the values and skills to make informed choices and shape a more sustainable future

Principles

- Universally-relevant
- Rights-based and a public good

Scope

- Expanded access to all levels of education
- Holistic and lifelong learning approach

Equity

Renewed focus on inclusion, equity and gender equality



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Quality

- Renewed focus on effective acquisition of foundational skills
- New focus on **relevance of learning for decent jobs**
- New focus on relevance of learning for social and civic life







Urgent Appeal : We are not on track to achieve SDG 4

School enrolment and completion

- **14%** of children and youth, or 225 million, will be out of school in 2030
- Only 60% will be completing secondary school in 2030

Learning

- 58% of children and adolescents do not achieve minimum proficiency levels in reading and mathematics in primary and lower secondary; 2/3 are in school
- 14% of adults -750 million, are not literate

Equity

 In low-income countries, the richest 20% are nine times more likely than the poorest 20% to complete upper secondary education

Finance

- One in four countries spend below 4% of GDP and below 15% of budget
- Annual \$39 billion financing gap but aid to education stagnant since 2010

We need to accelerate progress because Education is the key enabler for 2030

- Objective: to generate and scale up ESD action to accelerate progress towards sustainable development


